




LSCF Organization: History

- 1973:
 - Incorporated to "aid the Authority in the cultivation and advancement of conservation by serving as a permanent custodian of their endowment funds" First years
 - \$ via George Richardson Conservation
 Dinner
- 2004: LSCF and LSRCA are administratively separate organization. First Executive Director and Development Officer.
- 2010:
 - Foundation moved to "advancement" governance model - integrated staff into the Authority but still maintained a separate Board of Directors, letters patent and by-laws.
 - Executive Director is an active member of the Executive Management Team, and committees

Foundation Accomplishments

- Since 2003: raised almost \$13 Million
 - Almost \$9 Million since 2013
 - Diversified revenue base
- Supported hundreds of projects and outdoor education programs
- Hexagenia, LSRCA's research boat
- Launched the first capital campaign, the Connect Campaign
- Received the largest single grant in Foundation history: GICB \$4.17 Million
- Committed projects funds always disbursed on time and on budget
- It's all about partnerships:
- The best at what we do good governance
- Little resources what a team!
- 2021 raised the most in Foundation history
- NEW Carbon Sequestration Fund 2023 feasibility study













Scanlon Creek: Proud Legacy Of Education

- Outdoor environmental education since 1978
- Multiple generational
- While educational programs have changed and evolved, Scanlon Creek remains a place where you can experience nature.





The Nature Centre Today

- 3 re-purposed portables
- 2 classrooms, capacity of 60 students
- 2,800 sq ft of space
- Inadequate washroom and storage
- Inefficient climate control
- At the end of its life cycle





The Nature Centre Inspired Design

- Architects: Gow Hastings and Two Row
- Final design Informed by Indigenous knowledge and available budget: approx. \$8,000,000
- Objectives:
 - A multi-use building with flexible rooms to accommodate learning, training and congregation
 - Replace an end-of-life building
 - Build according to Net Zero Building Standard
 - Create a community gathering space for the enhancement of knowledge of the health of the environment



Net Zero Design (GICB agreement)

- Model a zero carbon balance
- Report embodied carbon (GWP of the building (kg CO₂e)
- Report total refrigerants (kg CO₂e)
- Provide a quote for carbon offsets (statement confirming that they are aware of the cost of offsets)
- Provide a transition plan (if they have onsite combustion) (why it is necessary and how they will adapt)
- Meet one of the three energy efficiency pathways (Report TEDI (ekWh/m2/yr and EUI)
- Report on seasonal peaks (peak demand) ((kW Summer and kW Winter)
- Report and justify modelled value (airtightness) (default rate, or justification if lower value claimed)
- And apply 2 impact/innovation strategies (description/strategy)



Connect Campaign Goal: \$ 3 Million+

- Since 2018
- Led by Connect Campaign Leadership Cabinet
- Pledged to Date: \$2,357,318
- Challenges with the pandemic
- Additional support: Federal GICB for \$4.17 Million







Implications of Bill 229

- Takes effect January 1, 2024
- Lays the groundwork for what programs and services the Conservation Authority can fund via levy
- Support from the Conservation Authority for operations since 2011 ends in January 2024
- 2024 Board Transition Committee
- Healthy reserves and new Strategic Plan
